

## **Interagency Task Force**

- 2020 NDAA directed that Naval Intelligence lead an Interagency Task Force (ITF) to "collect, exploit, and analyze operational and scientific and technical data of unidentified aerial phenomenon (UAP)"
- · UAP: Any aerial phenomenon that cannot immediately be identified.
- UAPs reported within the United States and around the world.
  - · Safety of Flight
  - National Security (b) (1)
- Effort: <u>Standardize</u> and "<u>De-Stigmatize</u>" Reporting (b) (1)
- We use reporting from operator interactions to cue various other advanced means of tracking and analysis.
- The ITF uses a combination of subject matter expertise and specialized tools to identify, collect, investigate, and report on these contacts.
- The results of the data are used to (b) (1) inform other U.S. Government partners and develop concepts for addressing the problem.

## "Tic Tac" Case 14 Nov 2004



- Nimitz CSG (CSG-11)
  - USS Princeton (CG-59)
  - VAW-117 (E-2C Hawkeye)
  - VMFA-232
  - VFA-41
  - USS Louisville (SSN-724)
- 30 Nautical Miles off the Coast of Mexico (south west of San Diego)
- It was "solid white, smooth, with no edges. It was "uniformly colored with no nacelles, pylons, or wings." It was approximately 46 feet in length.
- Pilots reported the incident through Intelligence Personnel, there
  was a large amount of <u>harassment</u> and <u>ridicule</u> throughout the
  Nimitz.
- Reporting terminated at 3<sup>rd</sup> Fleet, there was <u>no process</u> to share the reporting.
- Although the debriefs of aircrew and other personnel within the Strike Group validated the event, there was very <u>limited data</u> to support technical analysis.




























## **Current Assessment**

The ITF has collected reports dated from the last years that describe encounters with UAP. More than half have been detected via multiple sensors.


